"Jasper in Quebec" is situated 78 miles from Montreal in the Laurentian Mountains.

Therefore, you come first to Montreal and then kindly proceed as follows : -

BUS

Enquire at the Provincial Transport Co., corner of Drummond and Dorchester streets in Montreal, telephone UNiversity 6-8441. Express buses from Montreal to St. Donat stop right at the door of the Lodge at Jasper. One interesting feature, no change of terminals in Montreal, if travelling by bus.

BY TRAIN

Enquire at Windsor Station (Canadian Pacific Railway) corner of Osborne and Windsor streets, telephone UNiversity 6-5581. Detrain at Ste. Agathe ... Ask for Clark Taxi; they will take you to Jasper at a nominal rate

BY CAR
You may use either (A) routes 11 and 50, or (B) route 18.
(A) Starting from the corner of Peel and St. Catherine streets, go up Peel two blocks to Sherbrooke Street, turn left and go several blocks to Guy Street (tram-line) where you will see sign indicating route to Cartierville Bridge, seven mile distant. On crossing bridge, observe aim, "Koute 11". While villages are indicated on the map, the new modern highway does not pass through all of those shown, but road signs will provide all necessary directions. Follow "Route 11" to Ste. Agathe. A few hundred feet beyond the town you will see on the right the branch highway to St. Donat. (Route 30). Jasper is 18 miles along this road — four miles this side of the village of St. Donat. Jasper's signs along the road will show you the way.
(B) Aqfollows: At the corner of Peel and Sherbrooke instead of turning left, coming up from St. Catherine, you turn right and go on Sherbrooke af ar as Pie IX Blvd. As its will be and follow route 18 signs, through Terrebonne, Mascouche, St. Esprit, Ste. Julienne, St. Theodore, Notre Dame de la Merci, up to a point 1" libe at Jasper. The distance from Montreal to St. Donat is about the same using either of the two roads.

IMPORTANT TO NOTE

U.S. trains arriving in Montreal in the morning connect with express bus to Jasper. Also many plane flights do, ask us for special time-table showing the connection.




